President's Message

We will have a program by our 4-H members at our April meeting.

We will restart our door prizes at the meetings; the 4-H and Home School Groups will take over that part of the meeting. I want to thank both of the groups for their help and I also want to thank Jane Crone for all the years she did the door prizes for our meetings.

I have looked into doing another 'Field Trip in a Bucket' for a future meeting. This time the material will come from North Carolina; the mines in that area produce about ten different gemstones, so it should make for an interesting program.

We had an official Board Meeting on 22 March, thank you to the members who attended and gave us a quorum.

I'm sorry to report that our new 600 grit diamond grinding wheel, that I just installed, has already been damaged by careless use, it has a deep cut in the center of it. It only has about 20 hours of use and it will totally fail in a very short time. The 325 and 1200 grit wheels are also going bad. It maybe time to reinstall the old silicon carbide belts that fit our expanding type drums, the belts cost about \$2.00 each, they are 3 inches wide. The only drawback with this system is that the belts don't last very long; the way things are going our diamond wheels don't last much longer and they are \$70.00. The other option is to use the nickel-plated diamond wheels like we use on the coarse wheels.

The sign out sheet and the list of items that must be checked before locking up is temporarily on the White-Board. Please put your initials on the day you are foreman. This has been set-up for security reasons, so please use it.

At this time we need two or three Shop Foremen to help run the shop.

Molly is reworking the Lithophiles Tri-Fold information folder, thank you Molly.

One project that our society has to look forward to is rebuilding our Lithorama display cases. That project may be solved; Adam Heinke may use it for his Eagle Scout project. If Eric takes on the job, it is his job to direct what has to be done and not do it by himself.

Jenny is looking into having a display for the Lithophiles at the Innovation Fair at the Bankhead Theater on 14 April.

State Fossils

Tennessee State Fossils

Pterotrigonia thoracica, the fossil is a Bivalve seashell that lived during the Late Cretaceous Epoch and is from the Coon Creek Formation, McNairy County and inhabited the oceans that covered Western Tennessee about 70 million years ago.



Like other bivalves, which include mussels and clams, they all eat through siphon filtering their food out of the water; they don't have radula for scraping their food off of rock or plant surfaces.

This genus of bivalve is now extinct and disappeared about the same time as the dinosaurs.

In 1998 Tennessee designated this their official State Fossil


The same formation that produces this fossil also produces *mosasaurs* and *plesiosaurs*.
